Zookeeper for a Day General Information

Dates: April 22 - October 2, 2011

Ages: 13 and older

Choose from one of the following five animal care areas at the time of scheduling your Zookeeper For A Day program.

Savanna: 18-acre exhibit with African hoof stock and birds including Giraffe, zebras, Kudu, ostrich, etc.

Primates/Aviary/Dogs (PAD): Mangabey, African wild dogs, 2 aviaries, black duiker, and storks

Island Worlds (IW): lemurs, wallabies, cockatoos, Giant Aldabra tortoise, white-lipped deer, prairie dogs, kookaburra, and Mexican wolves

Rare Animal Survival Center (RASC): red kangaroo, red panda, cheetah, wild horses, gibbons, eagles

Animal Care Center (ACC): all education animals that are not available for public viewing, snow leopards, and Binda Conservation Discovery Center exhibit area

Miller's Children's Zoo (MCZ): the children's zoo – goats, llamas, sheep, donkey, miniature horses, etc.

If you choose to work in PAD, IW, RASC, or ACC you will need proof of a negative TB test within the last 12 months.

If you are a minor, a consent form must be signed by your parent or guardian acknowledging that you will be working in potentially dangerous areas. Anytime you work around wild animals it is potentially dangerous.

Half-day programs will start promptly at 7am and end at 1pm.

Full day programs will start promptly at 7am and end at 6pm with a lunch provided at midday. Program will run rain or shine so be sure to wear appropriate attire.

This program is available every weekday and most weekends. Only one participant is allowed in each area. When you are ready to book this program, please have several days available in case one of the days you want is already booked.
